This session will bring together researchers, policy-makers, and practitioners to celebrate Frances Shaver's sex work research. Inspired by Frances, sex work research has become more systematic and critical, legal responses have become more focused on rights, health, and safety, and sex workers and their allies have become more organised. This session will identify the issues currently facing sex work research, policy, and practice as a result of these changes and in light of Frances' contributions to the field. We invite speakers from research, policy, and practice domains to provide short (20 minutes) presentations regarding the major changes in their respective areas. These will be followed by a discussion of the implications for current conditions, a roundtable discussion, and reports

It might not surprise you that she emphasized how important it was that children and young people be provided with good sex-related education – not just about the physiology of sexuality, but about the emotional and inter-personal relationship aspects of it as well.

This is an especially important message here in Ontario since the newly elected government leader had promised to cancel the new program of sexual education recently adopted in the schools here. Too bad

that so much of the political discussion is taking us back to the “bad old days” where sexuality was not adequately dealt with in the schools. Is it done well in BC?

After the session a large group went out to celebrate Fran at a dinner event. I expect she was very pleased with the recognition for her career that the events reflected.

The meetings and presentations continued on Friday, Saturday, and even this morning on Sunday. We are taking the train later this morning so Fran is off at a final session and will be back to make the trip to the train station about 10:30. I expect I will finish this letter on the train to Montréal. I am now going to take a break to see if I can buy some cheese for our train picnic lunch.
