This letter is about the difficulties I faced when trying to apply for my summer class at UVic.

It all started when I knew that I didn't want to take six classes in September. UVic had an ASL class I was interested in, but at the time I didn't know if it would be offered in the summer. But you

need to apply well in advance because there is so much you need to do. First I had to apply and pay 71\$. I also had to order my transcripts for 10\$ each from Langara and The BC Gov. for high school ones. I also had to go to the registrar and order a letter of permission. I brought that letter to UVic and handed it in by hand ~~to~~ but they still lost!

I called them a couple times and they said it would take some time but it was lost.

It was really a problem because
